SPAIN | MATCH A TRIP | JUNE 9- 20, 2010

JUNE 9- 11 ~ MADRID

We start our adventures in Madrid, the capital of Spain. Our hostel is right off the Puerta del Sol and gives us easy access to the cosmopolitan inner city and the palaces of another era. We'll visit the world-renowned Prado museum, stroll through the Plaza Mayor and Retiro Park, and take in an optional bullfight. We will spend the evenings doing language and cultural activities to prepare for our upcoming homestays.

JUNE 12- 17 ~ ARENAS DE SAN PEDRO HOMESTAY

Following our time in Madrid, our group travels to a town just south of the Gredos Mountains (a few hours west of Madrid) where families are eager to meet and welcome you into their homes. Students, who will stay one to two per home, will live, eat, and share in the daily lives of the Spaniards. As most of the families don't speak English, your Spanish will improve rapidly! In the mornings we will work on service--typically we have worked on community renovation projects such as sanding, painting, and fixing up a youth center or historic building.

Activities are not limited to service work and feature afternoons of activities such as soccer games or language lessons. During several afternoons you'll enjoy swimming with local Spanish youth in the natural pools formed by water from the nearby mountains. Finally, the farewell dinner and community celebration will bring to a close an unforgettable week.

JUNE 18-19 ~ BARCELONA AND THE COSTA BRAVA

Next, our group travels to Barcelona! An historic city on the Mediterranean Sea, Barcelona has a plethora of sights from Las Ramblas to the architectural masterpieces of Antoni Gaudí. We'll visit Gaudí's famous Sagrada Familia on a leisurely bike tour around the city and spend time at Park Guell.

JUNE 20 ~ DEPARTURE

A final celebratory dinner will provide the backdrop as we exchange laughter and stories from the past month. Our friends and family are eagerly awaiting our arrival back home to hear about our experiences.



Tuition, Forms, and Due Dates

The fee for this program is \$2195 per paying participant. Tuition for this program includes all in-country expenses (lodging, transportation, three balanced meals daily, advertised activity fees, emergency medical insurance, and non-optional gratuities). It also includes two free teachers and an experienced Global Works leader to accompany your group. Not included are airport departure taxes, Program Cancellation and Interruption Protection Plan (optional), meals in the airport, personal items, or any activities not described in the itinerary or agreed upon prior to departure. The tuition does not include roundtrip airfare.

Based on a minimum of eighteen students, the tuition per student is \$2,195. In the event that group enrollment falls below 18 students, a \$50 surcharge per person below eighteen will be applied to each tuition. There is a minimum requirement of 15 full paying participants for a private trip. The schedule for payments and forms are as follows:
